

#### **SATs**

Parents will be aware that there have been a lot of changes to Key Stage 1 and Key stage 2 examinations. This year Year 6 SATs will take place on the <u>week starting 9<sup>TH</sup> MAY!</u> All Year 6 children must be in to sit the tests as it is this test that all secondary schools use to predict GCSE outcomes etc.... Schools have to look at the progress pupils make from their previous Key Stage. Please DO NOT BOOK HOLIDAYS during this week. Year 6 pupils will sit:

- One reading test
- Two spelling, grammar and punctuation tests
- Submit a writing mark
- Three maths tests

Year 2 SATs will also take place in the month of May. Please ensure that pupils are well rested and in school. The tests will take place over various days. Pupils will sit:

- Two reading tests
- Two maths tests

<u>Parents may have heard today's news that the Key Stage 1 Spelling and Grammar tests have been cancelled due</u> to the Department for Education leaking the exam paper. They will therefore no longer be taking place.

Year 6 tests are marked externally. Year 2 tests are marked internally and moderated by the Local Authority. The tests scores are compiled and submitted to the Department for Education. They return the outcomes of the scores and report back to school late in the summer term. We will then report the score to you. You will be given the following as a result: Your child is working 'At expected' or your child is working 'Below expected'. By expected they mean what is expected of that year group, i.e. they have met the curriculum outcomes for that year group. They may also give out more information, however they have not provided this information yet. Thank you for your understanding in this matter, I know it is an anxious time for us all.
