

SATs Week - For Our Amazing Year 6



I wrote to you last week about the National Year 6 Tests, which will take place for the whole of next week. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our current Year 6 for their continued hard work. They are a super year group who have worked hard to achieve great successes already. Whenever I go into their classrooms I am always impressed by how hard they are working and how determined they are to succeed. I hope they achieve all they deserve as I know they are really ambitious and want to do well. We have spoken to them about getting a good night's sleep, eating

well and ensuring that they arrive to school on time – please help them to ensure this. Also, I would like to remind parents that we will be offering Year 6 pupils a free breakfast next week from Monday to Thursday and that pupils should arrive from 08:30 onwards. This is a great opportunity for them to relax before the test and ask any questions. The pupils will not be able to re-sit any missed or late tests so please ensure the pupils are in all week on time.

Key Stage 1 SATS

Please note that between Monday 9th May and half term, the children will be taking their SATS tests for reading, writing, maths, spelling and grammar. It is <u>vital</u> that your child attends school <u>every day</u> during these weeks. If your child is absent, they will miss out on some essential revision and practise for the tests, as well the tests themselves, which they will have to sit at a later date.

Also please note that we will be having a meeting for parents on <u>Wednesday 11th May at 3:30pm</u> regarding the Year 2 SATs, please come along for further key information about the tests.

Stranger Danger

You may have heard in the local press about an attempted abduction of a pupil at Lynch Hill School in Britwell. The man was very well described as "white, young looking maybe in his mid-twenties, with green eyes, a tattoo on his left arm, wearing glasses, with brown hair flicked or gelled back and of thin build". Please ensure that you talk to your children about making sure that they do not leave the school with anyone else apart from you, even if it is a family friend. I am always shocked at how easily children walk off with others, despite our constant efforts to promote stranger danger. Often children are confused by the danger coming from a family friend or a well-dressed person. There is always an adult on the gate at Wexham as a precaution, however many of our children walk home alone.

Orienteering Competition

On Monday 25th April, 12 children from Year 5 took part in an orienteering competition at Langley Grammar. Our school came 5th – congratulations to all the children who took part – orienteering is a tricky sporting event and all the children did so well to learn these skills and apply them against many other schools.
