What is Sports Premium?

Sports premium is money allocated, by the government, to improve the provision of physical education (PE) in schools in England.

How the Sports Premium can be used

At Wexham Court we aim to improve the quality of PE and sporting activities we offer our pupils through:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy and active lifestyles
- The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport

The grant allocated to Wexham Court from the government was £10,477. The level of expenditure incurred by the school over the month period across its delivery is far greater the grant. The additional expenditure is funded from the schools core budget and effect subsidies our already broad and enriched Physical Education curriculum, which includes a full time, fully trained sports coa teaching materials , the provision of extended school sports clubs.
