I would like to start by saying thank you - thank you for being a supportive parent community. You play a huge part in the success of your children and this has been a very successful year. There are so many great memories, the children have gone from strength to strength despite this being the first full year they have experienced in the last two years.

We are unable to provide a lot of shade so please keep this mind. Please make a quick exit as we have a staff meeting in the afternoon.

If you will be bringing in any home-made food items to sell at the picnic, you will need to give these to your child to bring in on Wednesday morning. We will be setting up 2 tables/stalls (sweet & savoury) and we will lay out the food ready for you to sell. Please remember to clearly label all of the ingredients in the food. We would prefer savoury options as we have also arranged for an ice-cream van to be on-site which I know the children are going to love! Please can you give your children £2 to spend at the ice cream van.

Last week we gave out information about the purchase of uniform, on the same note I would like to remind you about children's trainers. Please make sure children to not come in with branded trainers as part of their daily uniform, this is not acceptable. Also, anyone with hair at shoulder length or below please make sure this is tied back. This is to make sure children are able to focus in class, at times walking around I have seen children struggling to write due to their hair distracting them or getting in their way.

We will have the Year 6 performance which I hope as many Year 6 parents as possible are able to attend, this marks the end of an era for our children, would be great to have you

there. There is also the leaver's assembly which is an event where I gush with pride and have a surge of sadness, please join us to celebrate your child's journey with us. For all other events, please keep an eye on the calendar above.

The next two weeks are set to be the hottest days of the year with an average temperature of 30+degrees so it is imperative that children come into school with a water bottle, sun cream and a hat. Year six will have an intermission during their performance so that they can get a drink of water.

There is so much going on this week, the Horticulture Judges will be in tomorrow to look at our produce and listen to what our children have learnt.
