Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you have had a lovely weekend. The sun was shining which makes everything a lot more enjoyable.

We have reached the final week of Summer 1, which has once again been a very busy term. Last week our KS1 children completed their statutory assessments. They all did very well, smiling and confident with all that they completed. It is easy to forget how young our children are completing these assessments - our Year 2 team worked hard to ensure this was as relaxed and comforting for the children as possible.

I would like to remind parents of the *why* behind attendance being important. At times it's easy to believe the 'odd day off' won't hurt, though research carried out on the effects of broken weeks at school is shocking. A child can have 95% attendance but that can still equate to 10 broken weeks - huge gaps in knowledge, disadvantaging our children. We expect a high level of attendance and punctuality from our students to ensure they get the education that they deserve.

This can be achieved by not missing school due to minor ailments, avoiding medical appointments during the school day and avoiding all family holidays during term time.


