A big well done to our Year 6 pupils, who sat their SATs exams this week. As you aware the tests changed this year and are much harder. After a very difficult reading test, the pupils soon got into their stride and approached the test with confidence and maturity. Thanks to the lovely sunshine, pupils were treated to pizza, chips and ice cream. I am sure you will give them plenty of time to relax this weekend. They still have to complete their writing tasks but these are spread out across the year. In addition to Year 6, Year 2 have also been taking their SATs. Clearly there is no real reason for them to know this and so please try to ensure they remain relaxed and as unaware as possible. They do however need to be in every day, so please continue to bring them in.













Rocket Science



The Rocket Experiment is going well and the students have been closely monitoring the progress and changes in the plants. On day 12 we found that 74% of the red seeds had germinated, whereas 64% of the blue seeds had germinated. On day 17 we calculated the percentage of seedlings which were still alive, and we found that one blue



tray in particular had 84% of the plants still alive.

On day 21, it was time to measure the tallest plant from each tray. Interestingly, we found that the blue tray had a greater average height than the red trays. One of our children has noted that one of the plants is turning purple – could this be an alien invasion?!



The scientists have concluded that despite the blue seeds having a lower percentage of seeds, which have germinated the growth is slightly better than

the red trays. So, which one is which do we think? Some of our opinions have changed as time has gone on.

We still do not know which seeds were which, but it seems so far that both packs are doing well. We have

just over a week remaining of the experiment and then our results will be collated onto the national database along with the other schools that were selected and we will finally be able to know which seeds are which.
