Teacher notes	Children create individual buildings to put together to make a town. The town can be burnt afterwards to recreate the Great Fire of London. Component 1 – Focus on drawing 3 different types of buildings. Component 3 – How many windows are needed? What shapes are these? Which shapes do we need to complete the building?	Teachers can provide children with options of: shark, fish, crab, jellyfish. Recommended to print in small groups. Produce a maximum of 3 prints. Examples of printing technique:	Component 1 – Advised to work in groups to make a face out of the foods. Component 2 – Look at basic shapes drawn on paper: circles, squares, stripes, irregular. Provide children with A3 paper with a head shape and neck included. Component 4 – Explore colour theory by painting inside shapes and then mixing two colours and painting into a different shape.
Key resources	Museum of London website – useful for resources: Plague Broadsheet 1666. This would be useful for component 1 – children need to understand why this was drawn and recognise the importance of artists recording history).	Polystyrene squares, rollers, paint palettes, block printing ink (no more than 10 rollers/palettes per class). Option to print on different coloured paper, sugar paper and different coloured inks.	Poster paint, A3 paper, palettes, photographs of the children (faces), variety of fruit.
