1	Identify a need linked to the implementation of the SIP
2	Clarify the aim of the PLC (aligned, memorable language) Name the group accordingly
3	Collate a reading and research list
4	SLT agenda item to discuss the reading and develop shared understanding
5	Identify community members
6	SLT agenda item to finalise timeline and strategy
